Ski For Life

One of the biggest OAS winter programs is the annual Ski For Life program which serves youth and young adults with disabilities through a partnership with the Bend La Pine School District. In 2022, OAS partnered with six local high schools to provide 157 experiences to 43 athletes. These athletes participated in up to four consecutive weeks of lessons, building skills and confidence both on the snow and off.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: COMMUNITY CYCLING



We like bikes.

In 2015 OAS began a community cycling program that at the time consisted of two handcycles, one tandem and a recumbent. Six times that summer OAS crammed these five cycles into a 30 year old van and drove them across town to Pine Nursery Park to facilitate a handful of cycling experiences.

Eight years and a pandemic later, OAS now permanently stores over 25 adaptive cycles of all shapes and sizes at Pine Nursery and in 2023 OAS provided 225 experiences, operating three or four days each week from Memorial Day to Labor Day. **Every experience was offered free of charge to the community.**

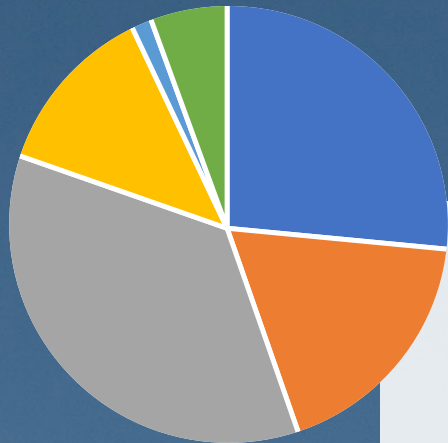

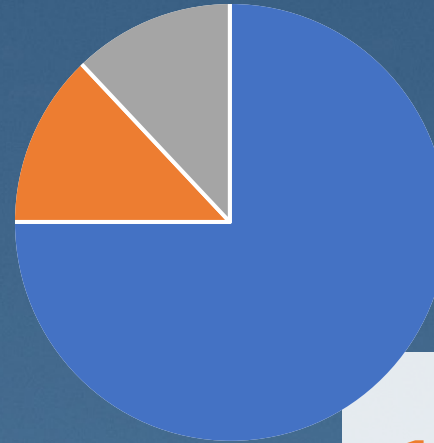

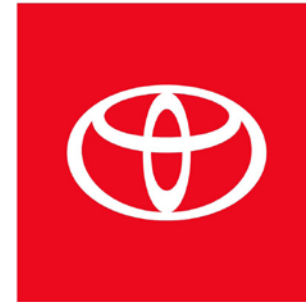
